MASTERS AGM Minutes

Monday 18th April 2011
THIS is a condensed version of the AGM Minutes. The full text is available online, in Vetrn Extra, and on request from the Secretary. A full transcript will be available at next year's AGM.

PRESIDENT Barbara Blurton opened the meeting at 7.05pm with 47 members present, and 16 apologies.

The minutes of the 2010 Annual General Meeting as published in the May 2009 were accepted as correct.

There were no matters arising from the 2010 Minutes.

Barbara Blurton added to her report (published in the April Vetrn) that Bob Schickert would not stand for office this year, and commenting that the committee would miss his wealth of knowledge and experience, she thanked Bob for all his past contributions.

Treasurer

The Treasurer's report showing general operating receipts for year of \$53,395.15 and payments of \$51,317.71 with an operating surplus of \$3,749.14 was presented along with the Auditor's report, prepared this year by Dave Roberts.

About 55-60% of members now request Vetrn by email or on-line and this has reduced subscriptions. Some State Championship payments are still due; overall, a slight surplus is expected.

Volunteers needed for 'Research on Reading Faces'

TWO years ago many Masters participated in the honours research project of a young student into fine motor control and its associated brain processes.

"You all helped me IMMENSELY," says Michelle Marneweck. "I cannot thank you enough for being such active volunteers in the UWA research community."

Now Michelle is working on her PhD, and looking into emotional facial expression recognition – for instance, the ability to recognise when someone is happy, sad, or angry.

Parkinson's

It will aid research into Parkinson's disease (PD).

She needs healthy older adults without neurological, cognitive or visual impairments (spectacle wearers are OK) to participate and act as a 'comparison group'.

Will you help? Here are some details.

The study entails two computer-based tasks to assess your ability to recognise emotional facial expressions. You will be asked to discriminate a series of faces that express an emotion (for example, happiness) from faces that express no emotion (neutral faces).

And you will be asked to discriminate a series of highly emotional facial expressions, from less emotional facial expressions. For example, tell the difference between an

WAMA IN BRISBANE.

AS we arrived to register on Wednesday and Thursday, some of us were in awe at the sight of the huge QSAC Athletics Stadium built in 1982 for the Commonwealth Games and wondered how many spectators were likely! The smaller stadium across the road was less daunting and used for the warm ups. I am sure many of you will be looking at the results on the MAWA website so I shall not give a lot of detail here but enough to say, we did achieve several gold, silver and bronze medals in many events and broke a few records at the same time. The enthusiasm and support amongst the members was fantastic and I am sure contributed to some great performances. It was a first Nationals for several members including Regina Crouch, Julie and Greg Wilson, Brenda Painter, Kim Thomas and several others. They all threw themselves into events with great gusto, some entering 15 events over the four days! We had good representation in the sprints, middle and long distance runs on the track, hurdles, Steeplechase (almost half entered were from MAWA), pentathlons, throws and the 8km cross-country, walking events and relays. Our club uniforms were easy to pick out and MAWA voices shouting encouragement were well heard by their teammates. One delightful lady, in particular, did a great job! Bob and Lynne Schickert were busy selling the AMA history 'Age is no Barrier' with some assistance from other members including Marg Saunders, who unfortunately had an injury early in the 800m run (which she looked very likely to win initially). There were a few delays, starter guns going off spontaneously, protests over the relay events and the usual tensions of a big event but the Queensland Masters were welcoming and informative and put in a lot of hard work to make the event so successful. Finally, on the Sunday evening we met at the Mt Gravatt Bowls Club for a well-earned dinner and trophies and speeches followed. Two MAWA members to receive trophies were Lyn Ventris and Lynne Choate. They were both up against strong competition so congratulations to both. Some of us then played barefoot bowls to end the evening and showed how absolutely no practice and experience can create chaos very quickly! Thank goodness we were better prepared for the National Athletics.

SOME months back I had the privilege of researching and writing a piece about MAWA's marathon men. My attention this time has been drawn to the success of the ladies since the early 1980s – when they were first allowed to join the club.

In its early days WAVAC, now MAWA, was a male-only domain; only around 1980 did the ladies take their place on the start line. No one can deny how much the fair sex have contributed to the club's success. In this article my research uses the lists of various trophy winners to give an idea of the magnitude of that success.

Awards

There are eighteen awards each year. Women are eligible for all but one – the Ted Maslen Trophy. There are three broad categories – road/cross-country running, road race walking and track & field. I have not included the two 'novelty' trophies (Guess Own Time and Darlington Partners). Around sixty women from 1980-2010 feature in the winners' list. Space prevents me covering each of them in detail.

Marg Forden, Valerie Millard, Lorna Lauchlan and Michele Mison have a significant number of successes to their names. Also appearing as winners five times or more are Jane Fletcher, Jill Chambers, Gillian Young, Robin King, Helen Lysaght and Amanda Walker. Another group of five- time trophy-winners can also claim achievement on the world stage, with multiple world records or medals to their name. These are the focus of this story.

Peggy Macliver



Peggy claimed her first club trophy as early as 1990, and has been winning them ever since. She is the only woman who has won trophies in all three categories – road, walks and track. Peggy's fourteen Patron's Trophy wins span five different age groups, and she shows every sign that this long run will continue further. Her profile appeared in

Ann Shaw



Vetrin (August 2008) featured a statistical report of the great Antoinette (Ann) Shaw. Ann won the Patron's Trophy in 1995 to add to her succession of RRC trophies. A member from 1989 to her untimely death in 2004, she had an amazing record covering all distances from 800m to the marathon. However, Ann's speciality was the 2000m steeplechase, in which she set seven age-group world records. When one considers that by her own admission she never mastered the barrier technique properly it shows how quick she was. An acquaintance recalls "She was a very simple soul, and most gracious. Despite her prowess she always suffered from pre-race nerves. I recall that she would have to make two or three trips up the hill to the ladies' at McGillivray before each race." Ann's record shows that she is a true MAWA legend who will always be remembered.

Lyn Ventris

Bunbury is a centre of excellence for race walking. Our third trophy woman, Lynette (Lyn) Ventris is in the van, figuratively and literally. Lyn has multiple John Gilmour Trophies and athlete of the championships awards. Her fame spreads much wider than our state boundaries. She has records and medals at state, national and world level; she is still in the top three all-time W45 world rankings over 5000m and heads the W45 and W50 10km and 20km rankings with world records. A very down-to-earth Aussie, and always with a broad smile on her

face, Lyn is respected by everybody in the theatre of race walking.

Lynne Schickert



Lynne Schickert is also a world championships gold medallist. Most of her trophy wins have been for race walking, but she can also add the Achievement Award (1997) and two Patron's trophies (2001, 2002) to her portfolio. A profile of Lynne appeared in TFNL (February 2009). In her earlier years, Lynne diversified from her main pastime of race-walking to running, completing many half marathons. Since moving back to Perth and joining MAWA in 1988, she has added the 2000m steeplechase and field events. Race walking is still her great strength, but it is no mean achievement to be able to claim a world championship gold medal in the stepples as well.

Dorothy Whittam



The final lady in this group with world recognition is Dorothy Whittam. In the early years of MAWA, Dorothy held a clutch of state, and some Australian sprint records. These were in the W40, W45 and W50 age-groups. Also a jumper in those days, it was the W50 triple jump which brought her world record in 1987. Dorothy is now an intermittent walker, but still competes strongly in the field events and holds a number of age-group state throws records. She can also claim two Patron's Trophies – as far apart as 1980 and 1997.

This catalogue of success, alongside many others that space precludes, emphasises the depth of quality in the club. It makes one realise how richly the MAWA ladies have enhanced its great traditions

WE had a fine 24-degree day for the first leg of the RR championship for 2011.


