PRESIDENTS REPORT

This year has been an exciting one for me culminating with the National Veterans Track and Field Championships here in Perth. These championships were highly successful, due to the meticulous planning of David Carr and his sub-committee. We all owe them a great deal.

During the year I have tried to expand and improve upon a number of aspects of the club. These were;

- a. <u>Safety l</u> believe we should keep working on the safety aspect to ensure that we provide safe running conditions for our members.
- b. Expansion of the Programme It is important to cater for all of our members. To do this we had to provide a more flexible programme by introducing the following.
 - 1. Separate events for race-walkers.
 - 2. Increased number of distance events.
 - 3. Providing an extra evening to increase track and field events.
 - 4. Abolishing of the novelty type events.

Although most of this has already been achieved, you will notice more changes on the new programme.

The Patron Trophy System was adjusted to allow members 2 opportunities to participate. I feel this was a very successful system.

Race directors have had an onerous time this year mainly due to the increased numbers of members running. Sometimes we forget that our race directors are all volunteers and have varying abilities and experience. I would hope we would all help where possible as minor things are always likely to go wrong.

Long weekend running camps vary in popularity, according to the venue. I would like to see them continue but the committee would have to be careful when selecting the venues.

The annual dinner was quite successful and it is hoped a similar one will be provided this year. Possibly the presentation of our major awards for the year could be included.

We have made a major push for clubrooms this year and I hope that eventually it will all come to fruition for us. Having a base to operate from will be a real bonus for us.

The re-introduction of the State Veterans Marathon Championship last year was very popular and we should be careful to make this an annual event.

During the past few months a committee has been set up to bring all athletic bodies together in W.A. I would like to see closer ties with all organisations in the state as this will allow proper planning of programme and we should all get a better opportunity to participate in a variety of events.

I feel particularly proud of our committee for the amount of hard work they have done this past year. It is a difficult but gratifying job and I know they have all approached their allotted tasks with dedication. They need your support and in most cases they get it. They look forward to your continued support in the future. I would like to thank them all for the way they conducted themselves. For those who are leaving the committee, I hope you have a rest and return at some time in the future. For those staying on, good luck for the coming year, stick to your task and I know you will enjoy great satisfaction from your effort.

I would like to make the following recommendations to the incoming committee.

- Keep working on the safety aspect and purchase more safety equipment.
- Recommend the club works towards having two race directors alloc-2. ated at both Sunday runs and all track meetings.

Our club has always been regarded as a very friendly club, but for some reason the A.G.M. seem to bring out the beast in some of us. I would like to see the A.G.M. conducted in a friendly atmosphere and would urge you all to think your questions out clearly before bringing them to the notice of the meeting. This will enable business to be finalised quickly and makes sure the meeting doesn't grind on into the late hours.

Finally I would like to wish you all well for the future. I have been proud to be your President.


