





"Foot Rot"By Novus Veteranus

When buying your sports shoes, check the fitting on both feet, as these are rarely identical for length and breadth. Wear your competition sox.

Try leaving the first two and the last holes unlaced, THis can allow for more expansion around the ball of the foot.and less restriction at theinstep. Furthermore, the ultr-long laces supplied these daysmay be halved, saving time on lacing and unlacing; plus two pairs for the price of one!

When tying up, make sure of a tight knot - even top pro tennis players can with a lesson on that. Buy the lightest shoes you can afford. Mathematical experts will prove to you that the fractional saving in shoe weight against body weight is next door to zero but, psychologically, you feel the difference every time you pick them up!

"Foot Note - for sprinters"

Watch and listen to the start of preceding races and get the rhythm of your starter's procedure. Even with qualified starters, there can be a lot of variation and a split second is all you need to miss out on a first!


