THE NATIONALS IN 'SUNNY' QUEENSLAND

Firstly delete the word 'sunny' and substitute words like 'wet', 'humid', 'flooded', 'rainy'. To be fair we saw the sun on the first day and the others saw it again 8 days later on their last day. (Alan and I by this stage had fled over the mountains into NSW to attempt to miss the floods on our way to Adelaide. We felt like the von Trapp family in 'The Sound of Music'...)

It was our bodies not our spirit that were dampened and our small team of nine soon made WA's presence felt. Our gold singlets showed up well on the track, the patch of yellow stood out in the stand and our voices led by Alan S (only half a decibel lower that Jeff Whittams) urged each other on.

We knew Alan's voice was carrying when he called 'Come on Dorothy' just before she went up to throw the hammer. Having acknowledged us she then proceeded to do her worst throw! However she later put that to right with a throw that earned her the bronze medal, a PB, and a new WA State record.

Alan won the first medal, a silver, and we were all excited for him and for us. This was followed by a team total of 16 gold, 6 silver, 7 bronze, and some very good performances. John Gilmour, Eileen and Dorothy were at their 'golden' best, but the most exciting race had to be Valerie in her 5K race walk, even if it was only because it was longer and a lot can happen in $12^{1}/2$ laps.

She had only beaten one of her opposition by 4 seconds in Melbourne and she didn't know if she could do it again. Val went out in front and stayed there. A definition of 'frustration' could be 'How to tell someone they are in the lead without actually saying it'. All we could do was yell encouragement at her from the sidelines and hope she could 'hear' between the lines. She finished over 2 minutes faster than Melbourne. Later she found out that she was only about 13 seconds off the Australian record, to which she replied something to this effect 'If I had known about the record I could have gone faster.' She knows now!

This was my first 'Nationals', and although everything pointed to a possible disaster with the weather providing a heavy track, no 'lift' for the field events, a road race held in pouring rain with water streaming across the road and numerous puddles, friendships were made and for the others, renewed.

Fellow athletes and their supporters are a friendly group of people and I was pleased to be among them. I hope that visitors to the 1989 Nationals to be held in Perth next year will go away with the same feeling.
